CORONAVIRUS UPDATE

You will no doubt be concerned as to the development of the Coronavirus across the country, Europe and beyond. As always at Haytor View we are keen to engage the children in having good hygiene routines to support us all staying healthy.

As you will be aware, good hygiene routines are essential to stop the disease spreading. With this in mind we are continuing to encourage children to wash their hands more regularly through the day, beyond the usual lunch time and toilet times, and using a hand washing routine that follows Public Health England advice. Alongside this we have spoken to them, and will continue to do so, appropriately dependent upon their age, about the low risk that coronavirus poses for them and of the responsibility we have for caring about our own and others' health.

As part of our provision we're keen to support children's awareness in a way which doesn't cause them unnecessary concern. If you have any questions please don't feel free to talk with your child's teacher.
