SITE SECURITY - UPDATE



We have received notification from the Local Authority that following receipt of our detailed response and action taken to ensure the continued safety of the children at the school, they are satisfied with the procedures that have been put in place.

The Local Authority have stated that the information provided by school improvement and safeguarding officers has provided assurance that the school has taken appropriate steps, both in relation to securing the site and reviewing internal processes, to ensure the safety of the children remains a priority in the school. As well as reviewing school standard operating procedures, we have further developed our provision in order to specifically meet the needs of individual children who require support in developing their understanding of safe behaviours.

AFTER SCHOOL CLUBS



Following recent changes to school procedures around access to the school buildings outside of school hours, **after school clubs will all now be finishing at 4.15pm whenever they take place.** Your child's club leader will be sharing the details of these arrangements and when changes will take place where these are necessary so please watch out for information in this respect and ask at the school's reception if in any doubt.

This will allow the school gates to be opened between 4.15 - 4.30pm whenever clubs are being held to allow collection of children, or to allow those with the necessary permissions to walk home alone. We are hopeful that consistent timings for school clubs will be of support to all parents whose children attend school clubs.
