CAR PARKING ON SANDRINGHAM ROAD AND QUEENSWAY

BAD WEATHER ARRANGEMENTS

With a cold snap this week reminding us that we are well and truly into winter now it seems an appropriate time to remind everyone of how you would be notified in the event of a school closure due to bad weather. With School Gateway now in place we would expect you to be advised of any change in normal arrangements via text message and via the school's website <u>www.haytorview.devon.sch.uk</u>.

Whilst there is no bad weather anticipated at the moment, should this situation change we would be aiming to contact you via the website or by text by 7.45am on the morning of any decision being made. Should we be in for a typical Devon winter we can be hopeful that such extreme circumstances will be avoided!

PARENTS CONTACTING SCHOOL - CHANGES IN COLLECTION ARRANGEMENTS

We appreciate that sometimes your plans can change, which means you need to make changes in the collection arrangements for your child. On such occasions, we would wish to have as much notice as possible of changes, in order that we can update the daily class log sheet in the office. If you are able to inform the office of any changes in the morning, it will best enable us to effectively support the end of day handover for your child.



There is a **2.30pm deadline** for contacting the office of any changes to collection arrangements, in order that we can put our internal processes in place and guarantee that your child receives the message. **We are not able to action any changes after 2.30pm, other than in the case of an emergency.**

We expect these changes to be rare, where we are concerned as to ongoing changes of arrangements, Mrs Galling or Mr Hampton will pick these conversations up direct with parents.
