CORONAVIRUS UPDATE

You will no doubt be concerned as to the development of the Coronavirus in Torbay. As always at Haytor View we are keen to engage the children in having good hygiene routines to support us all staying healthy.

As you will be aware, good hygiene routines are essential to stop the disease spreading. With this in mind we'll be encouraging children to wash their hands more regularly through the day, beyond the usual lunch time and toilet times, and using a hand washing routine that follows Public Health England advice. Alongside this we will be speaking to them, appropriately dependent upon their age, about the low risk that coronavirus poses for them and of the responsibility we have for caring about our own and others' health.

As part of our provision we're keen to support children's awareness in a way which doesn't cause them unnecessary concern. If you have any questions please don't hesitate in talking with your child's teacher.

There is a change on the horizon from 1st April 2020 when our team will no longer be working with ISS to create our meals, but with a new organisation behind them - Chartwells. We'll be telling you more about Chartwells and some of the changes that they will bring nearer the

time, but for now we'd want to reassure you that essential elements of our school lunch service will remain in place:- our school-based team; the prices of our meals; the timings and all in-school arrangements; essential elements of our menus, such as the popular 'deli-bar' option; the range of choices on offer each day.
