Early Years Curriculum Weekly Focused Children and Family Sharing

Thank you parents for the time you have given us during your busy days, we have just loved being able to meet with you more frequently to share your children's fantastic learning. It always makes us smile when we share these observations as a team during our morning planning meetings. Your children have so many amazing ideas and questions. Every day is totally new and exciting as the children find new avenues of thinking or challenge themselves to extend a previous question.





Please do take a moment to look in our numerous 'Watch, Wait and Wonder' books where we are recording the journey of children's thinking.

Reading

Completing your child's contact books is really important to us so that you can communicate with us things that your child has learnt at home. They also provide a place to record reflections about reading. It is **really important** to read regularly so that your child can build up a love of stories, language and widen their imagination. A bed time story is such a special time to share wonders and possibilities through language, as well as providing a calm end of the day for everyone!

Developing your child's memory capacity is vital to support their reading. There are so many skills which join together to allow children to become fluent readers. Children need to memorise sight words, on top of learning to blend and also understand the words and details in a story.

Forest school is an amazing opportunity for all children as it helps develop their confidence resilience, language, physical skills, creativity and much more. Although we wear the school waterproofs when it's wet and muddy, your child will need extra clothes to keep them warm or if it is a particularly hot day they will need a long sleeved top to protect them from the branches.

You will be informed when your child is taking part in a Forest School session. Please can you ensure your child has a long sleeved top added into their P.E bag ready for their Forest School sessions.

Community Working Together

We are working with Jane from Asda again. She is just AMAZING and brings so many experiences to the children. This time we have been looking at different healthy foods and using the food items to create designs and structures. We have decorated our own plant pots and sown our own cress seeds. We have even tasted a range of cheeses....'Red Leicester' being the most popular, blue cheese and goats cheese didn't go down well! Next term we will work with Jane again to learn how to make healthy pizzas.



Our Gardening Project

In the Foundation Stage garden we now have two planters, a small green house and planted wellingtons. Our planters will soon be filled with the sunflowers, cornflowers, peas, potatoes, carrots, parsnips, tomatoes, salad leaves seeds we have been sowing. Also wild flower seeds, new bushes and new trees have been planted across forest school. The saplings we have planted within forest school are cherry trees, maple trees, willow trees and rowan trees.

The aim is to develop effective lanauaae and communication skills which will underpin a ranae of critical thinkina, reasonina and social competency skills as well as increased ability to listen, maintain focus and learn effectively. It has been shown that improvements in levels of spoken language can have a positive impact on written literacy.
