Our Shared Aim

All of the people involved in our Phase, children and adults alike, have been working hard to build relationships with each other. We know each other really well, having enjoyed residential visits, class trips and lots of learning opportunities together. We have all spent lots of valuable time finding out about great learning behaviours we like to show when working with others, and how we can improve what we bring personally to group learning opportunities. We are currently learning that it's 'good to be me' where we recognise that we are all unique, brilliant human beings and we all have something to bring to our learning community. We genuinely believe in that community and hope if you have anything on your mind, that you could comfortably share that with us. We don't always get it right: when we trust that partnership though, we can solve our problems quicker and our children can enjoy learning and achieve even more.

Curriculum

Our whole team are working hard to provide a full and varied curriculum to all of our learners. We have spent a lot of our assembly time each day, thinking about our SEAL learning. SEAL stands for Social and Emotional Aspects of Learning. These sessions really do help us to become better human beings, appreciating difference around us as we help each other to become better learners on our journey of understanding.

We have an ongoing focus on Reading and Contact books and we really want them to be useful to you. They can be used as an opportunity for you to communicate with us if you can't get in to pass a message on. They also provide a place to record reflections about reading. I cannot stress enough the importance of regular reading: research shows that the majority of primary school children who read regularly and reflect upon that reading are successful in life - full stop! Many of our children and families are encouraging reading in such a supportive way that we are really enjoying being part of that reading relationship with you. Every teacher in our Phase spends time each week helping to grow this relationship by commenting on the reading that has taken place. Remember to use the Reading & Contact book – there is lots of extra information at the back. If you need a bit more support with any aspect of reading, please contact an adult in school and we would be only too pleased to help you further.

Finally a reminder of the messages we have developed so far this year that help children get ready to learn. You can use them at home too, to encourage and support your child further:

Don't give up! Give new things a go! It's okay to make mistakes – that's how we learn!

Challenge is good! Believe in yourself – you can do it!

Everyone can be a great learner – it's how hard you try that counts!

Year 5 information



Following our fantastic start to the year, we have been really enjoying getting stuck into our learning in year 5!

We've been enjoying setting our classroom up to create the best learning spaces, like our counting zone to help us practice our times tables and maths fluency skills.



We've recently been learning about shape in maths, reminding ourselves of previous learning and then extending our understanding into angles in triangles.



We have looked at lots of different text types in our Literacy learning. This has seen us writing recounts, reports, spooky stories and information texts! We are all very proud of our learning, particularly once we have edited and improved it so that it's the best it can be.

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We have also really enjoyed working with and learning from lots of different visitors at our school.

Home learning

Home learning is given out every week. It is very important that your child is given the opportunity to carry out their home learning activities at some point during the week, to enhance the learning that takes place in school. If you are finding it difficult to provide that time to your child, perhaps they would benefit from home learning club. If you feel that this would support you, please get in contact with your child's learning leader and we will make a place available for them. It's a great opportunity for your child to complete some of their home learning and to ask about anything they may not understand. Home learning club sees children discussing problems, finding solutions and completing activities together. When they need a teacher's help, they ask and are involved in a discussion to help them make progress. It really is a helpful learning environment and a pleasure to be involved in. Celebrations

Assemblies take place each day for our children. On Monday, certificates are awarded before our SEAL assembly. Check your child's Reading & Contact Book each week to ensure you don't miss their award! All parents/carers are very welcome. On Tuesday, the children enjoy singing with Mr Blurton then Mrs Cousins and Miss Shopland continue with the SEAL theme on Wednesday and Thursday. On Friday, a child from each class is selected by their teacher to receive an award for a variety of different reasons. Keep an eye out for the school newsletter for further details.
