Remember, your child may present as 'I've got this', but they really need your help to stay safe and learn about online engagement at home. Free packages such as Google FamilyLink and Qustodio, along with many others, are a simple and vital way to stay close to your child online, and allow you to talk about their experiences as they step out into a very significant online world. Do talk to your child's teacher if you would like to know more.

No-one will have failed to notice the cold weather has arrived! Please make sure that your children come to school wearing coats and warm clothing. If the weather is dry it is always valuable to spend time outside with friends and break and dinner time, and being prepared for this allows this time to be enjoyed to the full.
