Thank you to all of you who provided responses to the questionnaire we sent our regarding the implementation of the sex and relationships curriculum, we were really appreciative of the feedback and confidence demonstrated by parents / carers. We'd wish to assure that:

- Teaching and learning will be following the DfE requirements;
- The learning will be tailored to each of the year groups, reflecting their development:
- We will be using the JIGSAW resource as the structure for our teaching this is recognised by the DfE and Ofsted as providing appropriate coverage;
- We will be in touch with parents during the Summer Term 2022 prior to commencing the teaching to provide information on what will be taught and the terminology used, in order that parents can raise any questions or decide whether they wish to withdraw their child for this part of the curriculum.

#### CALLING ALL CHILDREN WHO WILL BE 4 YEARS OLD SEPTEMBER 2022

If your child has just turned 4 or is due to turn 4 before 31st August 2022, it is that time when you are asked to specify the school you want them to attend.

The Local Authority will be seeking your decision between 15<sup>th</sup> November 2021 and 15<sup>th</sup> January 2022. Please look out for the letter they will be sending to you in the post or speak with one of our Foundation Stage or Admin team.

Even if you attend our Nursery, you still need to apply for a place in Reception. Our provision is always popular and we see families not being allocated places, therefore make sure you get your application submitted by 15<sup>th</sup> January 2022. We are here to help, so please speak with us and we can guide you through the process.
