EASYFUNDRAISING

As a Community School, we have recently signed up with [easyfundraising.com](https://www.easyfundraising.com) to support us in raising money for our school.

What is Easyfundraising?

Easyfundraising is a website that partners with over 8,000 brands who will donate part of what you spend to a cause of your choice (hopefully Haytor View Community Primary School!). It won't cost you any extra. The cost is covered by the brand. Brands pay easyfundraising a commission for purchasing items they are aligned with. If you make a purchase, a commission is generated, and easyfundraising turn that into a donation which will be sent to our school-magic!



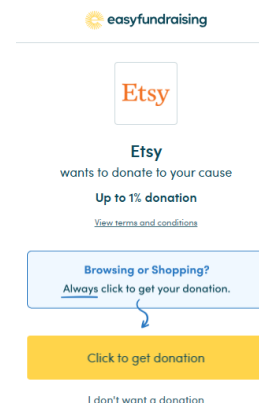
How do I create an account?

Once you have set up an account, your web browser will ask you to allow a browser extension called our Donation Reminder. This then means that any purchases you make on websites that are linked with easy fundraising. It looks like this:

You simply click on the yellow button, allow the page to refresh and then continue with your shopping! Any purchases made will then generate a donation for our school.

Our staff team have trialled this website and browser extension over the Summer Holidays and have found the process to be secure and simple once registered. We have also spoken with several other schools in our area who are securing the benefits of this charity in their settings to ensure we have confidence in the site before asking for your engagement.
