CALLING ALL YEAR 6 CHILDREN

Newton Abbot Youth Centre, have developed transition programmes because they understand transitioning from primary school to secondary school can be a challenging and often daunting time for young people.

The team want to help with this transition and give young people an opportunity to meet their new classmates, have some fun and help them feel ready for the new term. These sessions will be run and supported by experienced youth workers.

To support this transition, The Station (Newton Abbot Youth Centre) is opening their Wednesday evening youth club to Year 6 from 4th June until Summer. This will be alongside current year 7s.

They will also be hosting a Class of '25 party for young people (Year 6) starting secondary school this September. This has been a really successful event we have held for 6 consecutive years! This will be on Thursday 31st July 2025 @ 11am until 2pm. This is a mixed session for young people attending any local secondary school in Newton Abbot.

Notes for parents/carers:

- For our youth club sessions, we ask young people to just arrive with an emergency contact number. Following their first session parents will be sent a text to complete a registration form.
- Spaces must be booked in advance via QR code for the Class of 25' event (located on the posters around the school!)

SUMMER HOLIDAY LUNCH SUPPORT - THAT FOODBANK

As we approach the summer months, we are aware that the forthcoming summer holiday period can be particularly challenging for many families due to the absence of school meals. To better prepare and ensure that no children or families go without or struggle to manage the cost of additional lunches That Foodbank are offering holiday lunch support to any and all families who feel that additional support would be helpful.

THAT foodbank are able to provide a week's worth of lunch ingredients at the food bank over the school holidays. The food packs will contain ingredients to make lunches throughout the week including items like bread, cheese, ham, fruit and small snacks. These will be available for collection ONLY, usually a Monday morning, times will be communicated directly to those who take up the service.
