NURSERY WAITING LIST FOR 3 & 4 YEAR OLDS

Nursery provision at Haytor View is increasingly in demand, as we have extended the offer of 15 hours to free 30 hours for eligible families as well as providing paid places up to 30 hours.

Therefore if you have a child under the age of 3 and are anticipating wanting a place at our Nursery, please can you contact the school office in order that your child's name can be put on our waiting list to avoid disappointment.

We offer:

- 1) 15 hours of Nursery provision FREE for ALL children the term after their third birthday;
- 2) 15 hours of Nursery provision FREE for eligible families, once a child has turned three;
- 3) Up to 30 hours Nursery provision FREE for eligible families;
- 4) Additional hours of Nursery provision which can be purchased by families;

PARKING

ATTENDANCE

We appreciate that parents / carers are taking a really careful approach with children's levels of wellness, in order to keep the school a healthy environment. We welcome calls from parents / carers to enquire as to whether they should send their children into school as this supports consideration of your child and the school.

We have recently undertaken attendance monitoring and have identified where there are ongoing concerns over individual children's attendance, and where absence is above that which would be expected despite the current COVID circumstances. Letters will be going out to families where there are concerns and the Education Welfare Officer will be arranging to meet with parents / carers where children have met 'persistent absence' thresholds set by the Government and monitored by the Local Authority.
