We'll let you know how much you raise next week as we have counted the takings!


HANDS, FACE, SPACE

We pleased to be resuming our visits with professional partners in school such as the Educational Psychologist, these are conducted within our own risk assessment processes in order to ensure the safety of children is not compromised.





WE NEED TO REMIND OF THE FOLLOWING SAFETY MEASURES:

- Arrive not too early, for drop-off and pick up as close to 8.30am and 3.15pm as possible please.
- Follow the 'in' and 'out' lanes on the Queensway drive.
- Keep all children close to you when on the school site.

Keep moving away from the school gates to prevent any 'pinch points' at busy times.

KEEPING OUR SCHOOL ENVIRONMENT HEALTHY

We continue to follow the Local Authority, Public Health England and Government protocols and specific advice regarding any symptoms of illness, we greatly appreciate the effort and care each and every one of you is taking in relation to information you are sharing with us, decisions you are making and questions you are asking.

We know you are all committed to maintaining our school as healthy. We are tremendously grateful in your diligence in keeping children with any viral symptoms at home so that we are not seeing viruses of any sort move through the school. As we have said before, we have actually seen attendance levels higher than we might normally have seen in the first half of the Autumn Term.

We would encourage you to continue to adopt a policy of keeping children with any, even non-COVID, viral symptoms at home until these pass. This enables everyone to feel safe and comfortable in the school setting – it also allows any symptoms that do develop to be seen quickly and easily.
