# MORE THANKS, SNACKS AND FOOTBALLS!



Thanks to everyone who is supporting the smooth running of the school at dropoff and now pick-up too! We are seeing much less congestion and discomfort, for children and adults, at these times with your help. We are grateful for changes that you have made to routines to arrive more promptly in the mornings where needed as well as your patience and consideration at the end of the day too.

We are mindful at the moment that many children choose to opt out of the breakfast, snack and lunchtime offer made by the school - and of course are very comfortable with you making these decisions with and for your children. We are however sometimes seeing children accessing high levels of sugar



through the snacks that they are being provided from home and would ask you to take care with this as this can impact upon energy levels, providing sharp highs and subsequent lows. We are keen that all children have the energy they need to engage positively with the school day, but peaks and troughs that sugar snacks can bring can be difficult for your child to navigate. We'd ask that you bear this in mind as you choose snacks and packed lunches for your child. If you are unsure what is available in school, whether free of charge in the FS and KS1, or the paid offering in KS2 please talk to your child's teacher who can provide you with a printed copy of the menu.



We are always reviewing and developing our playground provision at break and lunchtimes and are making a few changes to arrangements around football, with everyone's safety and well-being in mind. Football will continue to be played at lunchtime managed by the staff team but this will take place using balls provided by the school. With this in mind please remind your child that they do not need to bring a football to school, and that these can be kept safely at home ready for a kick around with friends in the park. Yesterday, children across the school engaged in Internet Safety activities to develop their knowledge of how to keep themselves safe online. This saw some fantastic conversations with children, with many linking to the challenge of navigating adverts and online chats when gaming online.
