#### **WE'VE HAD ONE WEEK BACK!**


It has been a great week back to school, children have been engaging with their learning and parents/carers have been joining us for Time to Think, which has been great to be part of. Haytor View values the contribution parents and carers make, so it is wonderful having you join us for the start of the day, in spite of the need to wear face coverings at the moment.


We are hugely thankful for the time and care you are giving to your child's health and the health of the wider community before sending them into school. We have been delighted to receive telephone calls from parents asking for advice and guidance when faced with anything that they are uncertain about – we are always happy to help out at a time when there is so much to think about.

Many of you have been using lateral flow tests to support consideration of your child's health. As you will be aware from Government changes which came into effect this week, regular lateral flow tests are considered the most supportive means to prevent the spread of COVID. With your support, undertaking lateral flow tests with your children will prevent children with COVID coming into school.

Your careful attention will ensure that we continue to be able to successfully provide all staff a safe environment for all. With the latest Omicron variant showing itself to be much more contagious than previous viruses your support of the community at large is greatly appreciated.

Your consideration over the last eighteen months has really supported the school in minimising outbreaks of COVID, and as a school we continue to maintain our high level of vigilance and hygiene arrangements. Therefore together we would hope to continue to be able to wherever possible minimise cases of COVID.





#### START OF THE SCHOOL DAY HAS RETURNED TO 8.50am

**From Monday 10<sup>th</sup> January 2022** we returned to our pre-COVID start of the day timings, which allow us to conform with legal expectations of time spent in school, so:




- Time to Think will run from 8.35am to 8.50am from Reception to Year 6;
- All children from Reception to Year 6 will be expected to be in school by 8.50am. Time to Think will end at 8.50am.
- Children attending the nursery outside of these hours will need to use the Sandringham Road entrance to school which will be managed by members of the Foundation Stage team.
- If children arrive in school outside of agreed times they should come, via the Queensway entrance, to be welcomed by a member of our Admin Team at Reception.

Parents and carers can continue to join their children in Time to Think and will need to continue to wear a face covering. You know where we are so please talk to us about any concerns that you may have concerning these changes.
