# Parking Reminder – Keep Our Children Safe

We would like to remind all parents and carers not to park on the **yellow zigzag lines** outside the school. These markings are there to keep our pupils safe and ensure that everyone can see clearly when crossing the road.

When cars stop or park on the zigzags, it blocks the view of both drivers and pedestrians, making it much harder for children to see

oncoming traffic – and for drivers to spot them. This creates a serious safety risk, especially during busy drop-off and pick-up times. Please take a moment to park a little further away and walk the short distance to school. It may take a minute or two longer, but it helps keep every child safe.
