#### MONSTER PHONICS BOOKS

Many of you will be hearing from us and your children about Monster Phonics - our new approach to providing your children with the foundations to become keen readers. We are keen to support your children's development by sending Monster Phonics books home so that they can be shared and enjoyed beyond the school gates. It is vital to our provision that our stock of Monster Phonics books is maintain as any gap in our stocks of books impacts upon the learning opportunities that we seek to provide.
