KEEPING TRACK OF EASTER EVENTS & SUMMER CHANGES

We are firmly into the half term now, there is lots of learning going on and it feels like a good time to be sharing reminders of what parents and carers need to be aware of over the coming weeks.

Changes to the school day start time – 8.45am

Some weeks ago we explained that to meet national guidance we need to be adding 5 minutes to our school day. This means that from the start of the summer term, **15th April 2024**, the school day will begin at **8.45am**. This will see Time to Think running from 8.35-

8.45am each day, with doors/gates being closed at 8.45am for registers to be taken. Children arriving after this time will be recorded as late. With just over two weeks until this change it might be worth planning some practise!

Posters are up, the shield has been polished(!). Have some fun getting the aprons out and doing some baking with your family. All cakes received will be sold at a bake sale at the end of the school day.

KEEPING CHILDREN SAFE – BEFORE SCHOOL

School gates open at 8.30am each morning allowing children and parents into the courtyard at the start of the school day. Before this time the school driveway can be busy with vehicles as the school takes deliveries and sees visitors or staff arriving. Early arrival of parents and children can make the driveway a busy and potentially dangerous place for children who are often riding scooters in this area to fill their time.



If arriving early we would ask you to keep children safe and close to you - please do not allow them access to the car park or pathway as these are particular areas where accidents can easily happen.
