#### SUMMER CHILDCARE PROVISION

The school will not be providing childcare provision over the summer holiday, below is the update from the Local Authority  $2^{nd}$  July 2020 on Child Care arrangements.

Parents will be able to find what childcare will be available on the <u>Pinpoint</u> Site, this will soon start to include holiday provision. If at that time they cannot find childcare they can complete the <u>Unable to Find Childcare Form</u> and the Early years team will then arrange for one of our team to contact them. Updated information on those settings that will be open in the Summer holidays will also be posted on the Devon County Council website, when available.

#### RNLI WATER SAFETY MESSAGE

Please refer to the 2 previous newsletters via the GATEWAY regarding water safety, the following key points will support you in having a safe and enjoyable time when you are out and about over the holiday period.

#### How can I stay safe on the beach?

- Protect and keep an eye on your family
- Stay together and don't use inflatables
- In an emergency dial 999 for the Coastguard

#### Sun safety:

Don't forget: Sunscreen; Sun Hat; Sun glasses; wear a t-shirt; seek out shade between 11am and 3pm; slurp – drink plenty of water,

#### If a child does go missing:

- calmly check your surroundings first, ensuring other children remain supervised
- contact the lifeguards or police & keep them informed let all searchers know once the child is found.

### IF YOU OR YOUR CHILD IS FEELING UNWELL OVER THE HOLIDAY

- If your child is unwell they need to stay at home for 7 days, and their family need to selfisolate for 14 days.
- If a member of your family is unwell, the remaining members of the family need to selfisolate for 14 days.
- You are also encouraged to access a test for coronavirus.

If your child is unwell please do not <u>'take them out and about'</u> 7 days from the onset of their illness, if a member of your family is ill please do not <u>'go out and about' for 14 days</u>.
