WELCOME BACK EVERYBODY!

MORNING ARRIVAL ARRANGEMENTS

As a result of extending our offer to families whose children attend our nursery it is important that we are able to open our doors to them at 8.30am each morning. With the rest of the school starting at 8.35am we thought it would be helpful to share our morning opening routine with you.

At 8.30am the courtyard gates will be opened, and Miss Butler and her team will be ready to greet families. Doors to Years 1 and 2, the side gate providing access for Years 3 and 4, and the front door for Years 5 and 6 will be opened at 8.35am providing access to the rest of the school for all other children.

While a little bit tricky for now, these arrangements will become more straightforward as we take steps towards relaxing COVID-related safety measures. Watch this space for more on this front over coming weeks.

BASELINE ASSESSMENT FOR ALL CHILDREN IN RECEPTION

This term has seen the government introduce a process where children in reception classes across the country will be assessed. The purpose of this is to provide a basic picture of children's starting points as they begin their school lives. The activities involved will be administered by adults from the Foundation Stage known to children, and due to the nature of the process it is very unlikely that children will be aware of anything unusual as it will fit seamlessly into their playing and learning day.



All children will take part in this assessment unless you hear otherwise from Miss Butler or Mrs Penn. If you have any questions about the Reception Baseline Assessment (RBA) please feel free to speak to a member of the Foundation Stage team.

FOOD BOXES FOR CHILDREN UNDER 4 YEARS OLD

The Healthy Start project will see boxes of fruit and vegetables delivered directly to the doors of families, along with recipes to prepare the produce and information on the <u>Healthy Start</u> Scheme. Eligible pregnant women or families with children under 4 on low incomes can get financial support for fresh, frozen, and canned fruit and vegetables, cow's milk, infant formula, and free vitamins.

Boxes will contain the following:

- Fresh fruit and vegetables
- Booklet containing recipes, information and support on Healthy Start and useful signposting information
- Healthy Start vitamins for children or women, depending on option selected
- Fun 10 minute shake up games to help keep children active
- Breastfeeding support information

The project is open to any families eligible for Healthy Start, living in the Devon County Council area. The eligibility criteria is below:

Being pregnant $\underline{\mathbf{or}}$ having at least one child under four

AND

Receiving any of the following:

- Child Tax Credit (only if your family's annual income is £16,190 or less)
- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Pension Credit (which includes the child addition)
- Universal Credit (only if your family's take-home pay is £408 or less per month from employment)



There are a limited number of boxes available so this will be on a first come first serve basis. Orders will be accepted up until 24th September at 12 noon or until all boxes are allocated. Families can order a box directly from devon.cc/getahealthystart
