A FEW WORDS FROM THE CHAIR OF GOVERNORS - THANK-YOU....EVERYONE!

It's been an unusual half term at Haytor View – for the first time during the past two years we have seen significant impact from cases of COVID-19 in the school community. While we are fortunate to hear of few significant health problems, the need to self-isolate has caused challenge, concern and uncertainty. Our experience has shown that without doubt the current variant of the virus is more contagious, though seemingly less dangerous, than earlier viruses.

Thank-you to everyone who has supported us during this difficult period, by looking after yourselves, your families and others. We are grateful for the thought and care you have shown as well as all of the testing that you have done (!) to ensure that our school and local community is as safe as it can be.
