THAT LEARNING BUZZ!

It has been AMAZING to walk around our school this week and recognise the buzz of learning that is taking place in each class. As you know, we value our relationships at Haytor View Community Primary School as we recognise that children need to feel safe and secure to make progress in their learning. This week, we have seen children leaning on their relationships with adults and peers to show resilience and determination in their learning. Learning across the curriculum is now underway in all classes, with children returning to their learning routines in all areas of the curriculum. Having a look at the learning overviews that are outside of your child's classroom may support your discussions about their learning.



In addition to the class timetables and learning overviews, each class will be holding an **open parents' session** between the 29th September and the 10th October. These will all take place after school – your children are welcome to join alongside you. The purpose of this meeting is to share important information about the year ahead and to strengthen the partnership between home and school. During the session, we will:

- Outline the key areas of learning your child will be engaging in this year.
- Explain expectations for reading and home learning, including how you can support these routines at home.
- Provide guidance on how parents can help children develop good learning habits, resilience, and independence.
- Share information about clubs and enrichment opportunities that are available.

This is an opportunity to be in the classroom, hear from the teacher and ask any questions you have about this academic year. We look forwards to seeing lots of you in the sessions.

This week, our **Premier Education** After School sports clubs have kicked off. The club will see children engaging in **Tag Rugby** for this half term and **archery** next half term. We have spaces in each session:

Mondays 3:15 – 4:30 Years 1 and 2

Tuesdays 3:15 – 4:30 Years 5 and 6

Wednesdays 3:15 – 4:30 Years 3 and 4



We will run additional after school clubs for: **Art, Construction and Home Learning** starting next half term. Watch this space for more information and letters which will be coming your way soon.

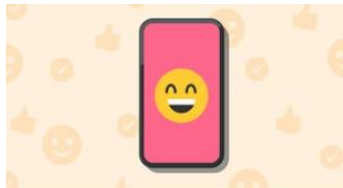
