KEEP OUR CHILDREN SAFE – PLEASE PARK CONSIDERATELY

Parking on the school site at pick up and drop off is not something we can make available to all – please approach us should you have particular needs that we can support.

We also recognise that parking local roads before and after school is a challenge with limited space available. Could we please appeal to everyone's sense of community and safety and ask that, whatever the circumstances, you avoid parking on dropped curbs and on the yellow hatched areas close to the school gates. Even if only stopping for a short while parking in these areas can make crossing the road treacherous for children and adults and restrict neighbours from accessing drives.

We want everyone to arrive in school safely each day - please play your part and help to keep all of our community safe on their walk to school by parking considerately.

NATIONAL STORYTELLING WEEK

National Storytelling Week takes place every year and is a celebration of the power of sharing stories. Stories teach us about the world, they allow us to step into someone else's shoes and feel empathy, they help us to relax and escape and they can help develop essential literacy skills.

This year's Storytelling week takes place 30th January – 5th February with all classes getting involved with reading and re-telling stories across the school.

SCHOOL UNIFORM

Thank you for the real commitment everyone has given in continuing to bring your children to school so well presented.

As you know, we see uniform (clothes and shoes) as providing children with a positive sense of themselves in school, of 'fitting in' and of 'being a part' of the class and school team. Standing apart, even if wearing favourite clothes or trainers, can lead to an underlying sense of discomfort that while not recognised by children, may unsettle them.



Should you have any concerns or difficulties in getting hold of uniform or black shoes please let your child's teacher, or any adult in school know as we have items of, often new, spare clothing which we can pass onto parents.



INTERNET SAFETY

Parental controls: Parental controls have been designed to help you manage your child's online activities. There are various types, some of which are free but others which can be bought. However, nothing is totally fool proof so they shouldn't replace the need for you to support and advise your child using the internet. Supervise their online activity: Keep the devices your child uses in communal areas of the house such as the living room or kitchen, where an adult is able to supervise. Primary-age children should not access the internet in private spaces alone, such as in a bedroom or bathroom.
