

Young Play Leaders – Impact Day

Haytor View's first Impact Day of the year focused on introducing the new Year 5 Playleaders to their roles. Fourteen pupils took part in a morning of training that helped them get to know one another, understand the responsibilities of being a Playleader, and identify the skills needed to support positive play across the school. The Courtyard Crew, who will be working with Key Stage 1, spent time observing existing play activities and helping to develop simple rules to keep playtimes fair and safe. They also learned a range of physical games—such as Dragon's Treasure, Time-Out, Clap or Catch, and Cat & Mouse—and had the opportunity to practise these before leading them with younger pupils.



After lunch, the Playleaders set up activities for the lunchtime session and showed great enthusiasm and adaptability, encouraging others to join in and adjusting games to meet pupils' needs. They demonstrated excellent teamwork and leadership, and the school is delighted with their positive start in their new roles.
