QUEEN ELIZABETH 2ND CONDOLENCE

As you are aware Monday 19th September was a bank holiday for the State Funeral of Queen Elizabeth 2nd, the first state funeral since 1965. We hope the day provided you and your family with the opportunity to share your reflections.

What you may be less aware of is the reflections the children have had in school, Mr Hampton led an assembly on 12th September supporting children's consideration of their experiences and developing vocabulary such as 'mourning' and 'pageantry'. As would be expected the children brought lots of thoughts and ideas to the discussion. There is a display in the Hub area if you wish to find out more about what the children shared.

SCOOTERS, BIKES AND TRIKES

Seeing children arrive on their chosen transport each day is one of the delights at being on the courtyard, children take great pleasure from riding their bikes, trikes and scooters to school. What we rely on is children

managing this in a way which best supports the other children and parents accessing the school site, simple measures really supports everyone's safety.

With this in mind we ask that 'transport users' think about the following:

- 1) Pushing your bike, trike or scooter across the courtyard;
- 2) Ride your bike, trike or scooter down the drive at an appropriate speed;
- 3) Think about whether you can stop your bike, trike or scooter suddenly if needed.

The Courtyard is a very time at the start and end of the school day, sadly if children are unable to push their bike, trike or scooter they will be asked to leave it at home, which would be a real shame







COVID SELF ISOLATION

Anyone with a positive COVID-19 test result is advised to try to stay at home and avoid contact with other people for five days, which is when they are most infectious. For children and young people aged 18 and under, the advice <u>three</u> <u>days.</u>

When you make contact with school, it's really helpful if you can tell the admin team when the positive test was taken. Thank you.

DEVON COUNTY COUNCIL POLICY ON 'LEAVE OF ABSENCE'

All leave of absences from school can only be agreed by the school in advance, so it is therefore very important that you apply to the school by completing an S2 form as far in advance of any absence as is reasonably possible. Please be aware that a school can only grant leave in 'exceptional circumstances'.

Please be aware, where holiday is taken without permission parents/carers may be issued with a fine of \pounds 60 per parent per child.

The S2 request for absence form can be requested from the school office - just get in touch if you need one.
