FOODBANK SUPPORT

Please feel comfortable speaking with a member of our office team to request a referral to THAT Foodbank, via Miss Shopland. We will be making a weekly call to the Foodbank to request parcels for any families who request them – please don't wait until you are going short of food - having food provided can ease pressure in other areas of household costs too and the team at the foodbank are brilliant in making life a little easier!



The only information we require is your address and the number of people living with you e.g. 2 adults and 3 children. T.H.A.T Foodbank accept all requests on a 'no questions asked' basis and generally ensure your request is prepared the day after, ready for you to collect from them between 10 am and 1pm Monday to Friday.
