MOVING INTO SUMMER – WHAT'S HAPPENING....

With so much being planned as we head deeper into the summer term it seems like a good time for a diary update. In addition to these activities we are really pleased to announce that Premier Education are running summer holiday activities based here at Haytor View as part national **Holiday Activities & Food Programme**. Activities will run on a **Thursday and Friday from 9.00am – 3.30pm beginning on Thursday 27th July**. The programme will continue for 5 weeks, 10 days in total, with each week having a different theme. Places are available for children from Reception to Year 6 and will include lunch. If you child receives free school meals places are available free of charge, and paid places are available at a cost of £17.49 per day.

CHILDHOOD VACCINATIONS

Starting or returning to school is an exciting time for all children. As they will be mixing with lots of other children, we have been prompted to share the NHS guidance on vaccinations to provide the best chance that your children are protected from harmful infections.
