NEXT STEPS

As the summer term is now coming to an end it seems like an appropriate time to reassure you about what things will look like when we get together again in September. You will be aware of the plans we have for children's return, so you'll know where you are going to be coming into. For all children in Years 1 – 6 this begins on Tuesday 8th September. We are busy speaking to parents and children in the Foundation Stage who have their own special plans.

What may still feel like a bit of a mystery is 'how?' – how is the school going to make the day work for everyone while meeting government guidelines for keeping everyone safe?

Be assured that while we will not be writing, emailing or texting you during the summer break there will be lots of work going on behind the scenes to make sure that everything is as it should be when the happy day arrives that sees us welcoming whole classes of children back to Haytor View. We will be in touch early in September, before you return, to provide you with all the details that you need to know to make your child's start a comfortable one for everybody.

We are not sharing any details now as guidelines may well change ahead of the start of the Autumn Term. You can be sure that though that we will let you have details of the following, and lots more besides:-

- Entrance and Collection Points and Arrangements
 - Any changes to Time to Think each morning
- Distancing needs (probably including a polite request to keep moving while on the school site!)
 - What can and can't be brought in from home
 - Lunchtime arrangements (a full menu will be available)
 - Use of bikes and scooters

What we can reassure you of, is that the school day will still have a flexible start, beginning at 8.35am, and that the end of the day will be at 3.15pm. So feel free to start planning with this in mind!

So as the gates close on the most extraordinary of all Summer Terms, we wish you a happy and restful break. Once again we'd like to thank everyone for the patience, cooperation, encouragement and respect that you have shown to the whole school team during these tricky times. Your support has been invaluable and has enabled us to bring our best to your children and families.

SUMMER CHILDCARE PROVISION

The school will not be providing childcare provision over the summer holiday, below is the update from the Local Authority 2nd July 2020 on Child Care arrangements.

Parents will be able to find what childcare will be available on the Pinpoint Site, this will soon start to include holiday provision. If at that time they cannot find childcare they can complete the Unable to Find Childcare Form and the Early years team will then arrange for one of our team to contact them. YAER 6 - KOOTH TRANSITION RESOURCES

As we move towards the end of term I wanted to remind you that KOOTH.com is available in Devon for young people aged between 11 – 25 years to access over the summer. For young people transitioning from primary to secondary school we want to ensure young people are supported through this challenging time and informed of the Kooth service and their accessibility to the support for their emotional health and wellbeing.



Kooth is a web based confidential support service available to young people that provides a safe and secure means of accessing mental health and wellbeing support either by

speaking to one of our online counsellors and/or engaging in our Kooth community online with the range of therapeutic support tools we have online.

IF YOU OR YOUR CHILD IS FEELING UNWELL OVER THE HOLIDAY

- If your child is unwell they need to stay at home for 7 days, and the family need to self • isolate for 14 days.
- If a member of your family is unwell, the remaining members of the family need to self isolate for 14 days.
- You are also encouraged to access a Test for coronavirus.

Therefore if your child is unwell please do not 'take them out and about' 7 days from the onset of their illness, if a member of your family is ill please do not 'go out and about' for 14 days.
