START OF THE SCHOOL DAY IS 8.50am

Please can we remind parents / carers that the start of the school day is **8.50am**, any child arriving after this time is marked as LATE. The school gates close at 8.50am, children arriving after this time are recorded as late.



Parents can bring children to school between **8.35am** and **8.50am** as part of our flexible start to the day, this enables children to get settled into their classroom, reconnect with their friends and feel ready for the day.

When children arrive late for school it causes them discomfort, as the day has already started and they are aware that they haven't had the opportunities which benefit them in having a good start to the day. Your efforts in getting your children into school on time are very much appreciated – thank-you.

SCOOTERS, BIKES AND TRIKES

Seeing children arrive on their chosen transport each day is one of the delights of being on the courtyard. Children take great pleasure from riding their bikes, trikes and scooters to school. What we rely on is children managing this in a way which best supports the other children and parents accessing the school site, simple measures really supports everyone's safety. With this in mind we ask that 'transport users' think about the following:



- 1) Pushing your bike, trike or scooter across the courtyard;
- 2) Ride your bike, trike or scooter down the drive at an appropriate speed;
- 3) Think about whether you can stop your bike, trike or scooter suddenly if needed;
- 4) Have you parked your bike, trike or scooter in a way which enables other people to park theirs?
