## YEAR 1 PLANNING BOOKS

The children in Year 1 have started using planning books to take ownership of their learning through play.

Each morning, the children are supported by adults in the setting to choose projects that they would like to be working on throughout the day. Children are then writing sentences to describe what they will be doing in their continuous provision time, what they will need to complete their project, who they would like to complete it with and any other information that they would like to add. The children are working towards evaluating their projects and building on their ideas throughout the week, returning to their planning books throughout the day.
