

HELP WITH COST OF LIVING - PAYMENTS FROM GOVERNMENT - £900

Do you receive any of the following payments - Universal Credit; Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance; Income Support; Working Tax Credit; Child Tax Credit; Pension Credit?

If you do you should be receiving £301 as the first instalment of £900 between 25th April and 17th May (with further payments coming in the Autumn 2023 and Spring 2024). This money will come straight into your bank account - next to it will be your NI number and the letters 'DWP COL'.

Keep an eye out for this money if you qualify - if you believe you should receive it and don't, you should contact the office that pays your benefits or tax credits for more information.

Please talk to us if you are struggling with the current cost of living crisis - we may be able to help. Even simply sharing your concerns may allow you to feel more comfortable.

What we think of as childhood now may feel different to your experiences and those of your parents and previous generations. This week's idea is outdoor chalking!

Chalk washes off with water so is easy to clean (especially with April showers!) and is easy to pop in your bag and take out with you.

To keep chalking fun and interesting, how about trying:

- To use as much space as possible, such as a pavement or park.
- Experiment with the chalk crush it, make it into powder, make it wet etc
- Introduce classic games such as hop scotch, noughts and crosses or hangman.
