

SPEAKING WITH STAFF, BAKE-OFF AND WORLD BOOK DAY



Within their roles, they aim to increase the support available to families throughout their journey, to help you navigate the pathway and provide support and wellbeing advice where needed. This offer extends to anyone between the ages of 0-18 years old, who have a Devon GP and are on the pathway for a neurodiverse diagnosis or have suspected neurodiverse needs.



This QR code is for their questionnaire form which allows young people, parents/carers and professionals to provide feedback on their experiences throughout the diagnostic process and will help to identify the specific needs of families in order to most effectively tailor support moving forwards.

QUIDS FOR KIDS

The benefits systems can be complicated and confusing, which can put families off claiming. Quids for Kids – Citizens Advice Devon is a free benefits information service offered to families with children or young people up to the age of 21 years old with additional needs, a long-term illness or disability. This service can help you find out whether you are able to claim benefits and also help to challenge benefits decisions if

CELEBRATING SUCCESS – 'COLLABORATING WITH OTHERS'


