NEW NATIONAL GUIDANCE REGARDING SELF ISOLATION

We are continuing to see a high level of COVID cases in Devon, as the OMICRON variant continues to work its way across the country. With this variant showing itself to be much more contagious than previous viruses the support of the community at large is greatly appreciated.

As a school we are currently experiencing our most challenging period of the pandemic with 5 class teachers testing positive over the past week or so.

During this current period please feel comfortable keeping your child at home if they are experiencing any symptoms of being unwell. COVID symptoms are much more varied than you might expect – we would currently encourage lateral flow testing if children are unwell in any way, or even 'just to make sure' if you wish.

COVID symptoms for children listed on devon.gov.uk include fatigue, sore throat, aches and pains, shortness of breath and headaches, as well as the more common high temperature, cough or loss of taste/smell.

Thank-you for your ongoing support with this very 'live' challenge.

- If children receive a positive lateral flow test they should start to self-isolate for 10 days.
- It is now possible to end self-isolation and return to school after 5 full days if you have 2 negative lateral-flow tests taken on consecutive days.
- The 10 day isolation remains in place for those without negative results from 2 lateral-flow tests taken a day apart.
- The self-isolation period includes the day symptoms started or when you took your test and the next 10 full days ie. day 1 is the day after symptoms or test.

If a member of the family receives a positive lateral flow test, all family members should take a lateral flow tests each day to avoid self-isolation. Children can continue to attend school providing that lateral flow tests remain negative. Your careful attention will ensure that we continue to be able to successfully provide and staff a safe environment for all.

MOST IMPORTANTLY - Should you have any concerns or questions concerning your child's health or next steps as you see symptoms or receive positive diagnoses, please do not hesitate to give us a call. We will always seek to make sure that any contact that you make is worth your while.

- Bobbi shared her Science learning, which she said she LOVED! Bobbi said she felt really dedicated to his learning, she had been learning about different phases of the moon which was new learning. She said that she is fascinated by the moon and space and loved finding out more. Bobbi said she was looking forward to sharing her learning with her mum and dad.
- Charlie shared his Maths learning, he demonstrated real pride over what he had achieved 'flicking through' his book. He talked about how he had engaged with challenge, had moved to the carpet when he couldn't see, took a book with him to write down his learning. Charlie carefully explained how he had answers the maths questions and demonstrated real care in his learning.
