#### **FUN & SAFETY - HAND IN HAND**

Year 6 were joined by seals during the kayak on the River Dart as well as enjoying the good times they had sharing cabins in the forest, cooking over an open fire, zip-wiring and tall tree climbing - lucky people! In terms of safety there are messages and signposts to resources designed to keep your children safe online. Do talk to us about this should you have any concerns or just want to talk through what can feel like a very complex world that our children are growing up in.

Also on a safety theme we are keen to ensure that children are safe when they arrive at school before the gates open at 8.30am – please check this out below. Linked to this it seems appropriate to remind everyone that the school car park is not available to parents and families in the morning to drop children off at school. Spaces are limited so this is not an offer we can make to all, as well as which it keeps the driveway for pedestrians and the few vehicles that need to access the school site. Should you require access to the school car park due to mobility or other needs, please talk to us – we're happy to make special arrangements where needs exist.

#### KEEPING CHILDREN SAFE – BEFORE SCHOOL

School gates open at 8.30am each morning allowing children and parents into the courtyard at the start of the school day. Before this time the school driveway can be particular busy with vehicles as the school takes deliveries and sees visitors or staff arriving. Early arrival of parents and children can make the driveway a busier and potentially dangerous place for children who are often riding scooters in this area to fill their time.

If arriving early we would ask you to keep children safe and close to you - please do not allow them access to the car park or pathway as these are particular areas where accidents can easily happen. Riding scooters



with so many people in a confined space and vehicles potentially coming and going is not safe. Don't forget that our flexible start to the school day means that you can drop your child off any time until 8.50am.

Let's not wait until an accident occurs - keep your children close to you and safe if arriving early at school.
