# TIME TO THINK & NATIONAL WEEKS - STORYTELLING & CHILDREN'S MENTAL HEALTH

We are pleased to be one of few schools who invite parents to join their children each morning to support their transition at the start of each school day. This continues to be something we are keen to maintain as it provides an essential opportunity to parents, children and school to feel connected - something we value greatly.



We would like to ask for your help during Time to Think by ensuring that you are in a position to leave your child to start their school day at 8.45am. Whilst we appreciate that sometimes it's hard to drag yourself away it is critical to the plans that teachers have in place to support learning that they are able to do so promptly from 8.45am. We also recognise that you may want to talk to members of the class team beyond 8.45am, however in such circumstances we'd ask that you simply request that they get in touch with you over the phone or make arrangements to meet at another time. We know that you will appreciate that any delay to the school day starting sees compromises being made to children's learning experiences as the school day is effectively shortened when it begins late. Thank-you so much for considering this and enabling us to maintain this very special time.

Next week we are celebrating two 'special' weeks in school - National Storytelling Week and Children's Mental Health Week. You can read more about what is happening during and beyond Children's Mental Health Week in the article below.



**National Storytelling Week** will see us kicking off the week with a short assembly on Monday morning, following which children will visit different classes to hear a teacher tell (not read!) them a story! Stories teach us about the world; they allow us to step into someone else's shoes and feel empathy; they help us to relax and escape and they can help develop essential oracy and listening skills - we're celebrating the power of storytelling and would invite you tell stories of your own to your children during the week. Perhaps you could tell them about your school life and the funny things that happened or just share some special

moments that you can remember meaning so much during your lifetime. Have fun telling stories!

#### CHILDREN'S MENTAL HEALTH WEEK

Next week is national Children's Mental Health Week. The focus this year is 'Know yourself, grow yourself.' To celebrate the event and raise awareness of Mental Health and Wellbeing, children across the school will take part in a live assembly in their classes on Tuesday morning. This will see presenters describe what Mental Health is and provide tips for children on how they can celebrate and be proud of who they are as



individuals, recognising their strengths and celebrating their successes. In classes, teachers will also spend time completing short activities that support Wellbeing, such as revisiting the '10 a day' posters that can be found in each child's contact book.

In addition and preparation for this, children in Key Stage Two will meet with the **Mental Health Support Team** on Thursday this week to learn about Mental Health, take part in a fun activity and then complete some pupil surveys so we can best support their wellbeing in school. The following week, children in Year 5 will have a second session with the Mental Health Support Team to learn abut skills and strategies they can use to support theirselves if they are feeling overwhelmed. The Year 5 Playleaders will extend this learning to consider how they might support others during lunchtimes.

### **BUSHELL YOUTH COMMUNITY ORCHESTRA**

The Bushell Youth Community Orchestra is a community orchestral experience for primary and secondary aged children in Teignbridge. Funding has been secured from the Devon Music Education Hub to develop and enrich local young orchestral musicians. The funding will be used to provide satellite training groups for any child who has started learning a musical instrument, but who is not yet ready to join the orchestra.



Children are invited to attend the training groups and work with local peripatetic musicians who will offer **free group development lessons** every Tuesday evening whilst the orchestra rehearses. Free instrumental tuition will be provided in brass woodwind and strings (violin and cello). These

## **CELEBRATING SUCCESS – 'COLLABORATING WITH OTHERS'**


