THANK-YOU FOR YOUR ONGOING CARE AND SUPPORT


Thank-you for supporting us in managing the health and well-being of all of the children and adults in school during recent weeks. While numbers of children currently testing positive for COVID across the school is relatively low it is currently as high as it has ever been. You'll also know that over the past two weeks, five teachers have received positive tests for COVID and have had to self-isolate. We welcome the last of them, Miss Manley, back today.

We'd ask for your continued care and vigilance for signs of your children being under the weather or unwell. Not only will this keep them safe but also limit any potential for the virus to spread in school. We would encourage families to continue to support children and adults in the home with regular lateral flow testing - you've done a great job so far - we all hope that this 'episode' will pass quickly.

If you have any concerns or questions as to whether your child should be in school, or just wish to talk your situation through, please get in touch with us – we'll always try to make your effort worth your while.

FACE COVERINGS

Following Government Guidance you will be aware that face coverings are no longer mandatory. However, people are still advised to wear face coverings in enclosed or crowded spaces, or when meeting strangers.





We would ask that for the current period, in order to reduce the risk of transmission of COVID in school, all parents/carers and visitors entering the school building wear a face covering, this includes:

- 1) When attending Time to Think;
- 2) When attending meetings in school;
- 3) When accessing the School Office / Reception.

If you do not have a face covering, you will be asked to put one on – the office has a supply of disposable face coverings.

If you are exempt from wearing a face covering:

- 1) Alternative arrangements will be made for you to attend meetings in order to provide a safe space;
- 2) If accessing the school office you will need to wait just inside the Hub door on the purple spot on the floor, in order that admin staff can deal with your query safely;
- 3) You will not be able to attend Time to Think, at this time

Please speak with a member of school staff if you have any questions regarding these measures. As with all our COVID Risk Assessment measures, we will continue to keep them under review and update you of any changes. We would hope that we can move on from this restriction very soon – thanks for working with us in the meantime.






NURSERY WAITING LIST FOR 3 & 4 YEAR OLDS
