ENJOYING THIS STUNNING SUNSHINE

As this beautiful Summer Weather continues, we wish to take this opportunity to flag the importance of children wearing sun cream to school, bringing a labelled hat and a ensuring they have a drinks bottle. We also wish to encourage you to ensure that your child's name is written in their school jumper (names wear off over time!) so that your child can feel comfortable removing them when they get hot. With 30 bodies in a classroom, we are regularly encouraging children to remove their jumpers when we notice they are looking warm. We are encouraging all children to take their drink



bottles outside during lunchtimes as well as encouraging play in the shaded areas of our field to reduce the risks of sun stroke. Labelled sun cream can be brought into school for your child to re-apply before lunchtime. We are not able to allow children to share sun cream due to the risk of allergies.
