#### FEELING BETTER - THANK-YOU FOR YOUR SUPPORT

You will be pleased to know that following last week's very unusual spike in Haytor View staff illness, things are getting back to normal and we are looking forward to welcoming back missing team members over the coming days. Pupil attendance has returned to more typical patterns. Thanks to those of you that have been managing challenging times with illness in your household.

We are grateful for your trust in us and for the effort that we know goes in to getting your children into school to be with us when days feel a little unusual and perhaps children are a little under-the-weather but fine to be with us. We are always pleased to talk things through with you if you are unsure whether your child is well enough to be in school so feel free to call us in these circumstances.

With no current 'waves' of illness passing through the school, you can feel comfortable bringing children to school as long as they are healthy – we are not currently enforcing 24/48 hours stay at home following sickness or illness.



With a shorter half term than normal this year due to an early Easter break, make sure that you have in your diaries that school finishes for half term on **Thursday 8<sup>th</sup> February**. Children then return to us on **Monday 19<sup>th</sup> February**.

#### CAR PARK – KEEPING EVERYONE SAFE

Thank-you to everyone for all of your help in keeping the school site safe during pick-up and drop-off times. We are really grateful to everyone for not using the car park during this time - even when parking on Queensway and Sandringham Road, or the weather, makes this a particular challenge.

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We of course continue to provide access to those with specific needs - please speak to someone on Reception to explore this if mobility/access presents particular difficulties.

#### **INTERNET SAFETY**

**Parental controls:** Parental controls have been designed to help you manage your child's online activities. There are various types, some of which are free but others which can be bought. However, nothing is totally fool proof so they shouldn't replace the need for you to support and advise your child using the internet. **Supervise their online activity:** Keep the devices your child uses in communal areas of the house such as the living room or kitchen, where an adult is able to supervise. Primary-age children should not access the internet in private spaces alone, such as in a bedroom or bathroom.

It is important that we keep our school site smoke and vape free and we thank-you for your support with this.



#### SCHOOL UNIFORM

Thank you for the real commitment everyone has given in continuing to bring your children to school so well presented.

As you know, we see uniform (clothes and shoes) as providing children with a positive sense of themselves in school, of 'fitting in' and of 'being a part' of the class and school team. Standing apart, even if wearing favourite clothes or trainers, can lead to an underlying sense of discomfort that while not recognised by children, may unsettle them.

Should you have any concerns or difficulties in getting hold of uniform or black shoes please let your child's teacher, or any adult in school know as we have items of, often new, spare clothing which we can pass onto parents.
