Con **Inursday this week**, the Mental Health Support Team will be coming into school and working with the children in Years 5 and 6 to provide the chance to learn about mental health, understand how

to balance it and consider the support that is currently on offer in our school, as well as considering what other developments could be made. This will be the first session of two, with

On **Friday 12th January**, the team will come into school for a second visit. They will work with the children in Years 5 and 6 again to build on their knowledge of Mental Health and gather ideas on how we can develop our support in school.

The FREE Autism and Us programme provide parents an opportunity to develop your understanding of autism and look at practical solutions to managing and supporting your child's presenting needs.
