ATTENDANCE AND SICKNESS - WHAT SHOULD I DO?

As a school community we should rightly feel proud of our commitment to work together to support children's attendance in school. This supports children in having strong attendance levels and as such avoiding missing out on learning opportunities. You, our families, are brilliant at this, and it's worth clarifying how we work together around stomach bugs as we enter the colder months where less time is spent outside and illness can spread more easily.

We manage very carefully our response to outbreaks of viruses and sickness bugs depending upon patterns that we see across the school. Typically we do not expect parents to keep children off school for 48 hours following a short period of sickness or diarrhoea as this is more often than not an isolated situation with many potential causes. In these circumstances we are happy to welcome children into school as soon as parents feel that they are fit and ready to learn and play. If parents have any concerns or wish to talk through their circumstances relating to their child's sickness we would invite you to call us so that we can help you make the decision that best fits.

From time to time we will enforce a '48 hours clear' policy for children returning to school after sickness or diarrhoea. This is when we see patterns of illness that suggest to us that a bug is being passed on in school. Analysing our attendance daily allows us to see very quickly when this is happening, and we will be in touch by text to advise parents when we are enforcing the '48 hours clear' expectation across the school.

As a rule of thumb, if you are in any doubt as to whether your child should be in school, please get in touch with us to talk things through. This is never a waste of our time as the health and well-being of your children and wider families is always a priority.
