

We would like to take the opportunity to **thank you** for your communication with us. This communication has been key over recent weeks where we have sought to maintain consistency for children in terms of known and trusted adults in classes. **World Book Day** 2025 is an opportunity for everyone to celebrate authors, illustrators, books and the joy of reading. This year's celebration takes place across the country on Thursday 6<sup>th</sup> March. To celebrate the event, at Haytor View we will be inviting children to bring a book they have enjoyed reading into school and to dress as a character from the book if they enjoy dressing up. This could be through a hand-designed T-Shirt or a fancy-dress costume. To help with this aspect of the day, the Coffee and Cake Team have a rail of spare costumes which you can borrow in the HUB, please pop in and take a look. On

#### **BEDS 4 KIDS**

We have recently joined the Beds 4 Kids charitable scheme to support our community in providing bedding essentials to children in the South Devon area who, for whatever reason, don't have anything suitable of their own. The charity provide support for families who are experiencing:



- A lack of a bed/suitable bedding of their own the child(ren) does not currently have a bed of their own and is, instead, sleeping on the floor, sofa, sharing a bed etc.
- Financial hardship the family is experiencing financial difficulties that prevent them from being able to purchase a bed or bedding.
- Have a stable residence ensuring the bed/bedding will be used in a secure and consistent living environment.

To request support, please speak with either Miss Shopland, Mrs Cousins, Miss Butler or a member of our admin team to share your request needs (bedding, mattress, bed frame or all of the above). We will need to ask your financial position to explain how you are experiencing financial hardship to the charity, how many bedding sets you require (including the size of the beds) and let them know a preferrable day for a visit to your home if a mattress and or bed frame are required – they will visit to measure the space and ensure they provide the most appropriate bed option. We aim to submit your requests within a working week of hearing from you, the company aim to respond within the following working week and will contact you directly. As this support is from a small charity, there may be longer wait times when multiple requests are submitted.

#### YEAR 5 PLAYLEADERS

This year, we have a WONDERFUL team of Year 5 Playleaders who have been working with Miss Shopland and the Mental Health Support Team to develop their skills in supporting others to enjoy their lunchtimes at school. In assembly on Friday, we will be presenting our Playleaders with their Playleader badges which they can wear with pride and the knowledge that they are supporting so many children with their care, empathetic listening and creative ideas for play.

#### YEAR 2 PADDLEBOAT DRAMA PROJECT

#### CELEBRATING SUCCESS – 'COLLABORATING WITH OTHERS'


