I am a Play Therapist working at Haytor View Primary. Play Therapy uses play to help children explore their feelings, express themselves and make sense of their life experiences. With twenty years' experience, I have advocated for neurodivergent children, and those with anxiety and trauma. I love being outdoors and believe access to the outdoors in Play Therapy improves well-being and the ability to regulate emotions. Outside work, I am involved in Devon's folk music and dance scene.



Kip Pratt

I come to Haytor View once a week to make music with the children, both individually and in whole classes, using lots of different instruments, including our singing voices. I take over the office downstairs and turn it into our music studio! We write and record songs, learn tunes and compose music to stories or themes that interest the children. Sometimes I bring songs of my own to learn, and sometimes the children teach me a song too. Each term we share what we have done with friends, and twice a year we put on a big concert for everybody. Music making is all about listening... to ourselves and to each other... a great skill to have in life. Everybody is musical, and I love the challenge of helping the children to share their skills. When I'm not working in schools, I love reading stories, writing stories and playing my instruments with other people.
