EXCEPTIONAL 'LEAVE OF ABSENCE' REQUESTS

We are seeing a number of requests being made for a leave of absence on the S2 form, what is important for parents/carers to include on the form is the details of the request and why they consider it to be 'exceptional' in order to support the school in deciding whether it meets the criteria for 'exceptional circumstances'.

Where holiday is taken without permission parents/carers may be issued with a fine of £60 per parent per child.



COVID SELF ISOLATION

Anyone with a positive COVID-19 test result is advised to try to stay at home and avoid contact with other people for five days, which is when they are most infectious. For children and young people aged 18 and under, the advice three

SCHOOL UNIFORM

Thank you for the real commitment everyone has given in bringing your children to school so well presented – at the start of the school year - thank you!

As you know, we see uniform (clothes and shoes) as providing children with a positive sense of themselves in school, of 'fitting in' and of 'being a part' of the class and school team. Standing apart, even if wearing favourite clothes or trainers, can lead to an underlying sense of discomfort that while not recognised by children, may unsettle

them. Should you have any concerns or difficulties in getting hold of uniform or black shoes please let your child's teacher, or any adult in school know as we have items of spare clothing which we can pass onto parents.





HEARING TESTS FOR CHILDREN

It's important to identify hearing problems as early as possible because they can affect your child's speech and language development, social skills and education. Treatment is more effective if any problems are detected and managed accordingly early on. An early diagnosis will also help ensure you and your child have access to any special support services you may need.

In children, signs of a possible hearing issue can include:

- inattentiveness or poor concentration
- not responding when their name is called
- talking loudly and listening to the television at a high volume
- difficulty pinpointing where a sound is coming from
- mispronouncing words
- a change in their progress at school

Speak to a GP or health visitor if you're concerned about your child's hearing.
Your child can have a hearing test at any age. I you have any questions about your child's hearing please don't hesitate in speaking with your child's class teacher.



We know that it can be difficult when the school asks for payments, especially if you have several children where payments need to be made at the same time.
