CELEBRATING SUCCESS - 'EVERY CHILD HAS COMFORT WITH WHO THEY ARE'

This week we are encouraging children to celebrate the way in which they engage with the school's Core Offer, particularly how they are connecting with those around them as part of our focus on 'Good to be Me'. This half term children have been spending time thinking about 'Good to be Me' and 'Healthy Me'. Children have been exploring Respectful Attitudes; how to demonstrate



mutual respect; treating people with respect and knowing that this will influence how people treat and view them too. This week in our Friday assembly, teachers will be paying special consideration to their whole class, sharing some of the successes of this half term. A few highlights are detailed below:-

- Foundation Stage Miss Butler- Reading and a love of stories has been our main focus, particularly 'The Dark Dark tale' by Ruth Brown which captured the heart of my class this term. The children's love of 'Black cats' continued as their excitement built and they met our Monster Phonic friends. We have now started to see colourful monsters and 'black cats' repeatedly added into the children's drawings and paintings.
- Foundation Stage Mrs Penn The addition of some new Mobilo construction blocks have inspired the children to create some amazing structures. We have used plans, come up with our own ideas for structures, we have shared, talked and learned to sort and tidy the blocks away brilliantly! We have made structures of monster trucks, fire trucks, cranes, robots and even a fidget spinner! Outside we have challenged our skills to follow rules to complete an obstacle course and to become more proficient at throwing a ball into a target. It has been fun to record how many balls we get into the target. We have dug our garden over and planted some wild flower seeds. Inside we grew some cress, harvested it and ate it too! Most of us were surprised when we liked the cress!
- The children in Year 1 have been amazing this term! It has been fantastic joining them in becoming
 authors, becoming fluent in reading our books (everyone has now had a fluency certificate!), solving
 cheeky chocolate problems in our maths learning, and finding out more about each other and
 ourselves every day. Thank you Year 1 for another super term.
- Year 2 are amazing. They know who they are, what they are, when and where they are and what to do to make themselves feel safe, happy and well. Their prosodic reading is going brilliantly and they are becoming really comfortable in tackling the challenges proper learning brings. It is a true joy and real pleasure to be able to spend my time with such amazing human beings!
- Miss Cameron shares that in **Year 2** we have a class full of musicians that can apply their Knowledge of notes B, A and G to play Hot Cross Buns and Mary had a Little Lamb on the recorder. **Year 1** children have been perfecting their singing voices and have had lots of fun learning to sing Spring Chicken.
- Year 3 have worked extremely hard this term; they have embraced their learning and developed a
 passion for all facts about Henry VIII (however gruesome!). Our classroom is always a hive of energy,
 activity and enthusiasm and this reflects the amazing children of team year 3.
- Year 4 have been working really hard on their learning this half term, in particular their times tables! They have supported, encouraged and celebrated with each other when someone in class has been successful in their learning. The children are developing their communication skills and beginning to master the 'Art of Conversation'. This has seen conversations becoming richer, more fluid and at times challenging when their opinions differ from one another. Their confidence is continually growing and they are developing an awareness of themselves as the amazing people they are!
- Again, it has been a real pleasure seeing Year 5 develop into more confident, enthusiastic learners
 with a passion for exploring the world around them and trying to understand it! I have thoroughly
 enjoyed being part of their journey in writing where we have been thinking more critically about our
 craft and challenging ourselves more.
- **Year 6** have got back into great learning habits in preparation for the learning journey ahead. We recognise the value in doing a job properly at the first opportunity and want to do it well to show we care. We recognise that learning with others in a friendly way is the only way to learn!
