WE NEED TO REMIND OF THE FOLLOWING SAFETY MEASURES:

- Keep all children close to you when on the school site.
- Keep moving away from the school gates to prevent any 'pinch points' at busy times.

WEARING OF FACE COVERINGS

Following the sharp increase in positive COVID cases both nationally and locally, alongside the increased transmission risk resulting from the new variant of Covid, we have undertaken an interim review of our Risk Assessment. As a result you may notice members of school staff wearing face covering when undertaking their wider duties e.g. handover at the start and end of the day or meeting with parents, in order to reduce the risk of infection for staff, parents and children.

We continue to encourage parents to wear face masks during drop off and collection times, and require all visitors to the school building to wear a face covering.

A face covering should:

- cover your nose and mouth while allowing you to breathe comfortably
- fit comfortably but securely against the side of the face
- be secured to the head with ties or ear loops



Visitors/members of the public who are exempt from wearing a face covering, if needing to access the site will be **required to contact the school in advance** in order that a time can be identified when access can be arranged without compromising the safety of the wider school population.
