WHAT A GREAT START TO OCTOBER!

We have been so pleased to have been able to review our COVID risk assessment arrangements in light of the current landscape within Devon, this has seen some welcome initial steps introduced:

- The school gate on Sandringham Road has been reopened. The Queensway and Sandringham gates are available at the start and end of each day in the same way as has been the case pre-COVID. We continue to ask you to take care when crossing Sandringham Road due to the increased traffic/taxi numbers linked to Glendinning House who are working with us to manage traffic in support of your safety.
- Entry to all classrooms in the morning is from the Courtyard. Coupled with the opening of the Sandringham Road gate this ensures that all children 'flow' into one area.
- Lunchtime changes. We have introduced a more 'fluid' approach to lunches and the use of the hall for eating and the playground for playing during lunchtime. This has seen children from Key Stage 2 sharing the playground for periods for the first time in over twelve months.

We are continuing to engage the children in discussing what changes they would like to see introduced and what is important to them, as we look to plan further steps for after half term. Of course, please keep sharing your own thoughts and perspectives with us.

Many thanks for all of your support and positivity this week. We greatly appreciate the patience and support you provide as we carefully navigate a safe way forward for you, your children and the wider school.
