<u>P.E. KIT REMINDER</u>

This year we continue to ask that all children wear their P.E. kit to school on their allocated P.E. days.

Your child's learning leader will share which days they will do P.E. with you over the course of the next two weeks.

P.E. Kit should include: black or navy shorts or jogging bottoms, suitable trainers a white T-Shirt and their school jumper.

SHARING YOUR THOUGHTS AND CONCERNS

It is important to us that you feel able to share any concerns or worries that you may have concerning your or your child's relationship with the school at any time. It is only through sharing these that we can hope to respond and work together to make your child's time with us happy, comfortable and successful.

Should you feel particularly uncomfortable you may see yourself wishing to make a complaint to the school. The first step in exploring any dissatisfaction would always be to speak with your child's teacher. Should this not bring you

the outcome you might have hoped for, we would invite you to then make arrangements to speak with the appropriate phase leader; Miss Butler, Mr Franklin, Mrs Cousins or Mr Hankin - raising your concerns and sharing your best hopes for a resolution. You can also engage Mr Hampton by making arrangements to speak with him at a convenient time, particularly if you remain uncomfortable with how your concerns or complaint are being managed.

Be assured that beyond these steps our complaints policy, which is available from our website or on request from Reception, highlights further steps that may be taken should any concern or complaint remain unresolved.

FOODBANK SUPPORT

Please feel comfortable speaking with a member of our office team to request a referral to THAT Foodbank, via Miss Shopland.

The only information we require is your address and the number of people living with you e.g. 2 adults and 3 children. T.H.A.T Foodbank accept all requests on a 'no questions asked' basis and generally ensure your request is prepared the day after, ready for you to collect from them between 10 am and 1pm Monday to Friday.

CELEBRATING SUCCESS - 'EVERY CHILD HAS COMFORT WITH WHO THEY ARE'
