

Year 3 worked with Mandy Biscoe a ceramic artist creating clay images of things they *love*. These pieces will be fired and painted by the children when Mandy returns to the school.

On Tuesday 22<sup>nd</sup> November Kate Green met Year 1 and Reception children to show them images of subways from around the world and to discuss how artist have decorated these spaces using different mediums. #### RECEPTION PLACES FOR 2023-24 – APPLY FROM 15<sup>TH</sup> NOVEMBER








#### INTERNET SAFETY - KEEP YOUR CHILD SAFE ONLINE

We recognise how many of our young people enjoy time online, so will be providing regular tips to help you to keep them safe online. Here's our first of this series.....

**Explore together and chat about online activities little and often:** Ask your child to show you their favourite apps, games and sites and encourage them to teach you how to use these. Ask them if anything ever worries them online. Make sure they know they won't be in trouble and can get help





This week we are encouraging children to celebrate the way in which they engage with the school's Core Offer, particularly how they are connecting with those around them as part of our focus on 'New Beginnings'. Children will be spending time thinking about **Being me in My World:** Understanding my place in the class, school and global community.
