#### WHERE DID THAT HALF TERM GO?

Half term seems to have sprung out of nowhere! There has been lots going on around school over the past 6 weeks or so – this week brought us **Safer Internet Day**, a timely reminder of how important it is for us to work with our children to stay safe online. We hope you have a happy and healthy half term break – it has certainly been an unusual half term for illness among both staff and children so we look forward starting afresh and beginning to look forward to warmer and longer spring days. A final reminder then that school closes for children at the end of the day on **Thursday 8<sup>th</sup> February** and we look forward to welcoming everyone back on **Monday 19<sup>th</sup> February**.



#### A QUICK HEADS UP!

When the summer term arrives in April, we will be subtly changing the start times of the school day for all children from Reception to Year 6. In order to meet government guidance that becomes law in September we need to increase the length of our school day by 5 minutes.

So advance warning, in case you want to get into practice next half term....

From Summer Term 2024, Time to Think across the school will begin with classroom doors opening as they do now at 8.35am. However **gates will be closed and registers will be taken at 8.45am** instead of at 8.50 as they do now. That means children will need to be in school each day by 8.45am, not 8.50am.

We will share more about this with you next half term, but we know there will be those very prepared among you who may want to be setting your alarms 5 minutes early and practicing new routines ahead of the change coming into place in the summer.

Again, have a great half term break and thank-you for all you have brought to the school lives of your children and the staff team here over recent weeks.

#### <u>SAFER INTERNET DAY 2024</u>

This year's Safer Internet Day assembly took place on Tuesday 6<sup>th</sup> February. Children from across the country focussed on the changing nature of the internet, how to use it safely, and how we can be influenced and the impact of Artificial Intelligence (AI). All children engaged brilliantly in the assembly showing their insight into the world of AI – they really are growing up in a different world to the one that we did as adults!

Subsequent lessons in their classes have been enjoyed with children demonstrating how skilled young people are at using the internet and considering their safety when doing so.

The children have been given the opportunity to take part in a poster competition which will be judged by a Governor and prizes will be awarded after the half term.
