Through the fear, panic and tears, Isabelle summoned help by dialling 999 as well contacting family members. Paramedics were swiftly on scene and able to support Isabelle's mum – who quickly responded to their help. Facing such a situation would be daunting for anyone but Isabelle took this all in her stride. Her mum, and everyone in school, children and adults are very proud of her for managing the situation so well.

Her story, which was inspiring to hear, is a reminder to us all to seek support for ourselves or others when this is needed. Whether in relation to health or other aspects of our lives it is important to be brave enough to ask for help – such requests really are a sign of strength. As you might expect we'll be making a bit of a fuss of Isabelle in assembly on Friday – as always you are welcome to join us from 9.00am in the hall.

#### DROP-OFF AND PICK-UP - KEEPING EVERYONE SAFE



Applications for children to join our reception class in September 2025 will close on January 15<sup>th</sup>.


