HEALTHY SNACK ARRANGEMENTS

As we head into new school year we are keen to make everyone aware of our provision and expectations in relation to eating in school. Children can have 1 piece of fruit or vegetables to be provided by home or purchased at school. Alternatively children can have: breadsticks; crackers; toast; crumpets; malt loaf, to be provided by home or purchased at school. In order to support healthy and balanced approach to daily nutrition, children are not permitted to take alternative items from their packed lunch box for break time.

SCHOOL UNIFORM

Thank you for the real commitment everyone has given in bringing your children to school so well presented – at the start of the school year - thank you!

As you know, we see uniform (clothes and shoes) as providing children with a positive sense of themselves in school, of 'fitting in' and of 'being a part' of the class and school team. Standing apart, even if wearing favourite clothes or trainers, can lead to an underlying sense of discomfort that while not recognised by children, may unsettle them.

Should you have any concerns or difficulties in getting hold of uniform or black shoes please let your child's teacher, or any adult in school know.
